Youth and Family Ministry: An investment in the future

What an exciting season we are entering here at Trinity! While the weather may start to get cooler, things are heating up in the Children's and Youth Ministry!

Our Children's Church is back up and running, fun events for our children and youth are scheduled, and our youth confirmation classes will be starting shortly! My goal as your Children's and Youth Minister is to provide a safe, fun, and loving environment that provides opportunities for young believers to be active participants in the Christ's Body alongside members of all ages. We aim to have a life-giving, self-sustaining ministry, but it will take time to build. I ask for your prayers in this endeavor: for wisdom, patience, compassion, and determination.

If your children haven't yet had the chance to participate in Children's Church, we invite them to join us on Sundays during the 10:30 service for a children's sermon, Bible lesson, and a fun activity! Our lessons will follow the church lectionary calendar, and all baptized children regardless of age are welcome to partake in the Eucharist every Sunday.

Also, We would love to have your children write their prayer requests on the whiteboard near the back of the Nave. In the intergenerational community of God's Kingdom, it is important for children to know that we value their thoughts, concerns, and prayers, and that we take them seriously as members of the body. Children often have deep-theological questions and insights! Our Children's Church will encourage their wonder and be a safe place for all their questions.

Our confirmation classes for Youth will be starting Sundays on October 1st. We will be studying the heart and language of the Baptismal Covenant over six weeks. For those of us who were baptized as infants, or very young children, confirmation is a chance to really take ownership of one's faith. During our classes, we will be exploring themes of community, repentance, service, and prayer. As someone new to the Episcopal Church myself, this course will be a great refresher on our core beliefs and values, and I am excited to be learning alongside our youth.

I invite the whole of Trinity Episcopal Church to pray for our class of confirmands and their families, and to support them in upholding their Baptismal Covenant.

If you or your youth are interested in confirmation, but have not yet told the clergy or me, please let us know as soon as possible, so we can ensure that all confirmation students have the proper materials. The class is open to all youth in 6th Grade and above; if you or your child is younger but wishes to be confirmed, please speak with me and Father Bill.

As I continue to learn more about Trinity, my dream for youth ministry is to collaborate with our local community and other churches. Young people are eager for connection. Fostering relationships both with their peers and other generations is key to their investment in the Church. It is often tempting for us to think that the young are "the future" of the church, but the reality is that they already are the church. God prizes their faith. Heaven rejoices with equal delight in every person who comes to Jesus and chooses to follow him

I know that with God's help, Trinity's Children and Youth ministry will continue to grow, both in number and in strength. I look forward to growing alongside you and helping our children and youth cultivate a strong faith.
