Celebrating a Holy Lent: Opportunities for Spiritual Growth at Trinity

The "Invitation to a Holy Lent" contains some of the most powerful words in the entire Book of Common Prayer. It reads, in part, "Thereby, the whole congregation was put in mind of the message of pardon and absolution set forth in the Gospel of our Savior, and of the need which all Christians continually have to renew their repentance and faith." (BCP, p. 265)

This year, we gather for the **Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper** from 5:30 PM to 7:00 PM on Tuesday, February 13 at the Hollandsworth Commons on the campus of the Trinity School of Texas. **Ash Wednesday services** will be held at 12:15 PM and 6:00 PM on Wednesday, February 14. We have moved the **burning of the palms** to immediately after the 10:30 AM service on Sunday, February 11, so that more people can participate and help us prepare the ashes that we will use as "signs of our mortality and penitence" as we begin our Lenten pilgrimage (please bring your palms to church).

On the Sundays in Lent (except for March 10), our 9:15 AM adult Christian formation offering will focus on a study of Brennan Manning's *The Ragamuffin Gospel* led by Chris and Tisha Grotemat. The theme of the book is described as follows: "God gives us His grace, willingly, no matter what we've done. We come to Him as ragamuffins—dirty, bedraggled, and beat-up. And when we sit at His feet, He smiles upon us..." Books are readily available online and we will have copies available at the church for purchase for \$15. Rachel White will be reaching out to youth and their parents about a Bible study about the journey of Jesus to Jerusalem and the Cross. The precise date and time is being set in conversation with parents. Please email Rachel White, rwhite@trinityparish.org for details. Our Wednesday night potluck and formation offering will continue to explore Dr. Tom Wright's reflections on God's self-revelation in nature, history, and Holy Scripture.

Two special offerings (requiring advance registration, see my contact info below) will focus on the Episcopal Church's commitment to racial justice and reconciliation. On Wednesday, February 21 from 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM in the parish hall, we will be hosting "Traces of the Trade: A Tale from the Deep North." Dain and Constance Perry are Episcopalian lay leaders who met at Trinity Episcopal Church in Boston. Dain is white and discovered that his family were among the largest slave traders in the United States. Constance is African-American and the descendent of enslaved persons. The couple have traveled the country, showing a film about Dain's family history and facilitating a discussion about racial reconciliation in light of the Gospel and our Baptismal Covenant. Dinner and childcare will be provided, but space is limited, as we are inviting partner congregations, including St. Michael's and several historically Black congregations in Longview. To reserve your place, please contact Fr. Bill (frbill@trinityparish.org, 903-399-1190). On Saturday, March 9, we are hosting the One Human Race workshop from 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM. Both events require pre-registration and are brought to us with funding from the community engagement team of the Episcopal Health Foundation.

All of these opportunities are meant to prepare us for Holy Week (March 24-30) and Easter Day (March 31), when we remember and celebrate all that Jesus did and suffered to bring us into loving and righteous fellowship with God—and with our fellow human beings.

Trinity Veterans Quarterly Report

January 16, 2024

Trinity Veterans met Sunday, 0900, January 14, 2024, and updated their contact list. This was the first meeting since Covid19 shut down public meetings. We had five attendees and one guest. We also decided to meet on the second Sunday of the beginning of the first month of each new quarter. Our future meetings will be held at 0900, in the adult Sunday school room of TEC on April 14, Jul 14 and Oct 13, 2024. Mark your calendars.

We discussed how important it is to support all veteran programs. Our group will be supporting the following events: Wreaths Across America (Stan Wiley), Memorial Day, July 4th, and Veterans Day. I will make speeches on Memorial and Veterans Day, and we will require two flag bearers on these days. If you want to flag bear at the 8 a.m. or 10:30 a.m. service, let Gayland know and he will set up your schedule.

Gayland volunteered to continue as the veteran's leader. If I can help you in any way, please text, email, or call me any time.

We should continue to invite speakers to our meetings. Anyone of you can invite speakers, but please coordinate with Gayland to get on the schedule. Last year, Dee Shappell invited two WWII pilots to speak, and it was a delightful open forum meeting. One of the pilots flew a P51 Mustang fighter plane and the other pilot flew the famous Blackbird SR71 spy plane. Gayland invited the Gregg County Texas Veterans Advocate to several meetings to keep us informed regarding current veterans' benefits.

Future projects: we will check with the city of Longview to see if there are projects where we could assist that would help local veterans, such as Teague Park, The Sons of the Confederate Veterans, etc.

Dee spoke about Yates Memorial Cemetery, in Scottsville and Marshall, TX. They offer free burial plots to needy veterans. This cemetery is associated with Patty Yates Shappell's family.


